## 英文レジュメ

## Academic Visits to Institutes in Europe in Research of the Formation of Marx's Capital

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During last September (1986) I made academic visits to institutes in Europe in reseach of the formation of Marx's *Capital*; IMSF (Institut für Marxistische Studien und Forechungen) in Frankfurt am Main and IML (Institut für Marx ismus-Leninismus) in East Berlin.

Dr. Winfried Schwarz, staff of IMSF, and I debated on the theoretical significance of "Chapter 6 Results of the Immediate Process of Production". He emphasized the importance of the second section of the *Results*, i. e. Reproduction of the Capitalistic Relation, whereas I insisted that the second section is in fact the summary of Chapter 5 of the second variant of *Capital*, and that the third section has new specific content.

Dr. Jürgen Jungnickel, staff of IML, and I discussed the problem of the writing order of the " $\gamma$ ) Machinery..." of the *Manuscripts 1861-63*. He and I chare the same assumption of discontinuity writing order, while Prof. F. Yoshida, Prof. I. Ohmura and Prof. S. Ohno in Japan estimate the continuity writing order. The main question which Dr. Jungnickel and I debated was the theoretical motive with which Mark had transited from " $\gamma$ ) Machinery" to "5. Theories of Surplusvalue". He presumed that the motive was Marx's inquiry into what machinery adds to its replacement of labour at page 210 of Notebook V, while I showed my assumption that the motive was his problematic of the conditions of social reproduction in pages 210 -211 of the same notebook.
